

Examples using “**ag teacht orm**”:

Tá ocras ag teacht orm.

(taw uk-russ egg chakht orum)

I'm getting hungry.

[Hunger is coming on me.]

Tá tart ag teacht air.

(taw tart egg chakht air)

He's getting thirsty.

[Thirst is coming on him.]

Tá tuirse ag teacht uirthi.

(taw tir-shuh egg chakht ur-hee)

She's getting tired.

[Tiredness is coming on her.]

Bhí codladh ag teacht orainn.

(vee kol-lah egg chakht oreen)

We were getting sleepy.

[Sleep was coming on us.]

An bhfuil biseach ag teacht orthu?

(un will bish-akh egg chakht orhu)

Are they getting better?

[Is improvement coming on them?]

Beidh tinneas cinn ag teacht orm.

(bay chin-uss keen egg chakht orum)

I'll be getting a headache.

[A headache will coming on me.]

Tá slaghdán ag teacht ar an gcailín.

(taw sly-dawn egg chakht air un gal-yeen)

The girl is getting a cold.

[A cold is coming on the girl.]

Tá fearg ag teacht ar an ngarda.

(taw far-ug egg chakht air un ngar-dah)

The police officer is getting angry.

[Anger is coming on the police officer.]

Tá imní ag teacht ar an dochtúir.

(taw im-ree egg chakht air un dokh-toor)

The doctor is getting worried.

[Worry is coming on the doctor.]

Ní raibh eagla ag teacht ar Phádraig.

(nee rev ogg-lah egg chakht air faw-drig)

Patrick wasn't getting scared.

[Fear was not coming on Patrick.]
