

Examples:

Tá airgead uaim.	(taw air-uh-gid wem)	I need money.
Tá bia uait.	(taw bee-ah wet)	You need food.
Tá deoch uaidh.	(taw djokh wy)	He needs a drink.
Tá cathaoir uaithi.	(taw kah-heer wuh-hee)	She needs a chair.
Tá síob uainn.	(taw sheeb weng)	We need a ride.
Tá cabhair uaibh.	(taw kow-air wev)	You need help.
Tá comhairle uathu.	(taw kor-lyah wuh-hu)	They need advice.

Tá carr nua ó Mháire.	(taw kawr noo-ah oe woy-rah)	Mary wants a new car.
Tá léine eile ó Sheán.	(taw lay-nuh ella oe hyawn)	John wants another shirt.
Tá deoch ó bhean.	(taw djokh oe van)	A woman wants a drink.
Tá bia ó fhear.	(taw bee-yah oe ar)	A man wants food.

Tá airgead ón mbean.
(taw air-uh-gid oen man)
The woman needs money.

Tá codladh ón bhfear.
(taw kol-lah oen var)
The man needs sleep.

Tá peann ón ngarda.
(taw pyawn oen ngar-duh)
The officer needs a pen.

Tá comhairle ón dochtúir.
(taw kor-lyah oen dokh-toor)
The doctor wants advice.

An bhfuil deoch eile uait?	(un will djokh ella wet)	Do you want another drink?
Bhí tuilleadh uathu.	(vee till-ah wuh-hu)	They wanted more.
Ní bheidh síob uaim.	(nee vay sheeb wem)	I won't need a ride.

Nach raibh cathaoir ón mbuachaill?
(nakh rev kah-heer oen moo-khal)
Didn't the boy need a chair?

Bíonn cabhair ó na páistí.
(bee-un kow-air oe nuh pawsh-chee)
The children do be needing help.
