An bhfuil pinn agaibh? Do y'all have pens?
Tá. Tá pinn againn. Yes. We have pens.
3. An bhfuil peann ag aon duine? Does anyone have a pen?
Tá. Tá ceann agamsa. Yes. I have one.

Cé aige a bhfuil peann? Who has a pen?
Tá ceann ag Seán. John has one.
4. Cad a bhí agat? What did you have?
Bhí mála agam. I had a bag.
Ní raibh mála agam. I didn't have a bag.
An raibh mála agat? Did you have a bag?
Nach raibh mála agat? Didn't you have a bag?
