

There are 11 irregular verbs in Irish. Verbs are irregular when their forms do not match the patterns we have learned so far, or when the stem of the verb (the form to which the endings are added) changes in different tenses. Another feature of irregular verbs is that the independent form (used in positive statements) and the dependent form (used in negative statements and in questions) can be different.

We previously covered the most useful and most irregular verb: *bí* (*be*).

In the previous lesson we looked at five additional irregular verbs. These five all have an unusual behavior in common: like *bí*, they use *ní*, *an* and *nach* in the past tense instead of *níor*, *ar* and *nár*.
